

# Message from Karen Rau, **Executive Director**

We often get the question: "Why don't you have more dogs?"

My answer is: "Not having dogs is a good thing. It means less dogs need our help".

MAPS' mission is to focus on meeting the needs of our community. One of those needs is to provide housing for domestic pets until they are reunited with their owner. If an owner does not come forward to reclaim their pet, then we start the process of getting them ready for adoption. This includes spay/neuter surgery, vaccines and microchip.

In Marshfield, the return to owner rate for dogs is very high; around 86%. For cats, not so much at only about 11%. We are fortunate that so many owners reclaim their lost dogs.

That is not necessarily the case in larger cities, primarily in the south. That is why many area shelters and rescues have opted to bring dogs in from overcrowded shelters and provide adoption opportunities for dogs that may otherwise be euthanized.

In our area, we have a huge cat overpopulation problem, which can be alleviated if more people would spay and neuter their pets.

Two programs we are currently

working on to address this problem is to provide more low-cost spay/neuter opportunities and TNR, Trap-Neuter-Return. *(read more about TNR inside)*.

Our number one priority is to address our own community's needs before looking beyond our borders to assist others.

However, in May, when we received an emergency phone call from the folks at Wisconsin Humane Society in Milwaukee through our affiliation with the Bissell Pet Foundation, we knew we had to help.

132 animals (91 dogs; 41 cats) from Texas needed to be relocated quickly and Wisconsin received the call to assist. The animals were flown to the Waukesha airport on June 1 thanks to the Bissell Pet Foundation.

They all made a pit stop in Tulsa so local veterinarians could assess their health, give them vaccinations and perform blood tests before coming into Wisconsin.

We quickly arranged to rent a cargo van to pick up SIX dogs in Waukesha and safely transport them back to MAPS to find forever homes.


## **HELP FINISH THE FLOORS!**

## **IN THE NEWS** *TRAP - NEUTER- RETURN*

On May 25, 2021, the Common Council approved Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) for the City of Marshfield.

This is an important step in promoting positive outcomes and humane treatment for hundreds of community cats wandering our city streets. Many cities have already implemented TNR successfully and we are grateful to our city officials for listening to our concerns and approving this much needed program for Marshfield.

It is hard to imagine that every day thousands of cats live outside. But it is true, even here in Marshfield. For decades, countless unaltered female cats have reproduced up to twice a year resulting in HUNDREDS of litters.

Many of those kittens grew up (if they survived) without any interaction from humans and therefore became feral.

Our goal is to get a handle on this situation so less kittens are born, which will result in fewer feral community cats over time.

#### \* WHAT IS TNR? \*

Feral community cats are humanely Trapped, brought to a veterinarian to be spayed or Neutered, vaccinated, ear tipped (the universal sign that a community cat has been altered and vaccinated), and then Returned to their outdoor home where they are most comfortable. Any community cats deemed friendly and adoptable will be taken in at MAPS to find indoor homes.



#### **\* WHAT ARE FERAL COMMUNITY CATS? \***

- Cats that are under-socialized and fearful of people
- Cats that don't want physical contact with people
- Cats that prefer the companionship of other cats instead of people
- Cats that are accustomed to being outside and cannot adjust to life indoors

#### ♥ WHY TNR? ♥


Every year, MAPS takes in numerous litters of kittens, many are very sick and afraid of humans. We also receive many feral community cats through ordinance/animal control. These cats are NOT happy about being at the shelter. Our goal is to get them spayed/neutered, vaccinated, ear tipped and put them back to where they came from and where they are happiest.

With TNR, we can work on stabilizing the population humanely, improve the quality of life for these cats, save taxpayer dollars, address citizens' concerns, and help the entire community reach a solution that benefits everyone.

## WHY SPAY/NEUTER?

An unspayed female cat, her mate, and their offspring producing an average of 2.8 surviving kittens per litter at a rate of two litters a year adds up quickly.

## OUR HISTORY

#### **SEPTEMBER 2011**

MAPS began our lifesaving mission when a small group of concerned citizens took the time to review the process for handling stray animals for the City of Marshfield. In reviewing the process, a necessity was realized; our community desperately needed a humane pet shelter.

#### **FEBRUARY 2012**

The Marshfield Area Pet Shelter, Inc was determined a tax-exempt 501C(3) non-profit organization.

#### **JANUARY 2013**

We acquired a parcel of land in the Air Business Park on Marshfield's south side at the end of the cul-de-sac on Downwind Drive where our new facility is located today.

#### **OCTOBER 2013**

Volunteers renovated an empty space inside Marshfield Mall which served as MAPS first physical location. Adoptable cats were housed at this location from Feb 2014 to March 2020. The space was known as our Adoption Center.

#### **JUNE 2015**

Volunteers retrofitted an old airport terminal building at 210 W 29th Street to serve as an animal shelter. We took over the stray cat contract for the City of Marshfield on Sept 30, 2015. We operated within two separate locations: our intake shelter on 29th Street and our Adoption Center inside Marshfield Mall for 5 years.

#### **JULY 2016**

MAPS hired our first staff member, Kaitlin Loberg as Shelter Manager.

#### AUGUST 15, 2019

A ground breaking ceremony was held and construction of our new facility began in Sept 2019.



#### AUGUST 20, 2020

Our new facility was completed and we moved all our animals to our new location. Community members contributed \$1.5 million dollars to build the first humane animal shelter for the Marshfield area.
