Message from Karen Rau, Executive Director



The Safer At Home Order on March 23 began a series of events like no other. The way we lived our daily lives changed and we, like many businesses, had to adapt to those changes.

To protect the health and safety of our community, volunteers and shelter staff, we made some very tough decisions. We closed our adoption center inside Marshfield Mall and moved all our adoptable cats back to our intake shelter on 29th St. We dismissed our 60 incredible volunteers who we relied on to help us with daily chores.

We then closed our doors and the process for adopting was changed from walk-in visits to by-appointment only. I learned a lot about the resilience of our dedicated staff. Three staff members committed themselves to covering all animal care shifts from 7am to 8pm seven days a week for the next 6 months.

They worked together to ensure the needs of our animals, our organization and our community were met. I am so thankful for our staff, volunteers, donors, adopters and fosters for helping the shelter through these challenging times. Despite a worldwide pandemic, a dream came true for our community with the completion and move to our new 9,000 sq ft, state-of-the-art facility at 3500 Downwind Drive on August 20th. A virtual tour through our beautiful facility is available for viewing on our website. Future plans for a grand opening and ribbon cutting ceremony will take place at a safer time.

We could not have made such strides without your support. Now more than ever, your generosity is needed. The fundraisers we rely on to help with daily expenses have been modified and income from our events are less than expected.

Our biggest fundraiser of the year, our Paws & Pancake Breakfast in November has been canceled. Our lifesaving shelter needs donations and fundraisers to fulfil our mission for homeless animals. Your generosity NOW will save lives.

After months of preparation, we are officially moved into our new facility at 3500 Downwind Drive!



The new facility is designed with present and future needs in mind. Our free roaming cat room is named in honor of Brittany Zimmermann.


FACILITY HIGHLIGHTS:

- Eleven spacious dog kennels with double sided housing for year round access to outside area and heated outdoor flooring system for Wisconsin winters
- Eight cage free cat roaming rooms for adoptable felines
- Two outdoor 'Catios' for felines to enjoy a safely contained environment
- "Get acquainted" room for adopters & pets
- Spacious one-vehicle garage with additional space for much needed storage
- Private, secure keyless entry with 24/7 access for animal drop-off by law enforcement
- Two separate isolation rooms for dogs & cats



- Large lobby/reception area to welcome visitors
- Conference room to host meetings, training sessions, education and community events
- Robust security system with cameras, proximity readers and keyless entry
- Second story with extra bathroom and storage for our all-important fundraiser supplies


PLEASE NOTE: Due to COVID-19 precautions, we do not have public open hours. We are byappointment only. Masks are required.


